- Residential Placements – how does that process work?
 - Documenting in the IEP (consider your interim placement)
 - Determined by eligibility, age, and then individual needs
 - Intensive versus non-intensive

- Residential and Educational options
 - 34-37 Application and contracts
 - Must have a detailed history and clear path of escalating service needs
 - Must have detailed community resources exhausted or involved
 - Reintegration plan always required
 - Application renewal needed annually
 - Some students placed by the courts/DCFS
 - Some alternative funding sources with ICG grants
- New Legislation Reminders for 2019
 - P.A. 100-0996 (SB2350) - Active shooter drills with law enforcement observation now must take place in the first 90 days of the school year while students are present (remember to ensure psych safety in all emergency exercises)
 - P.A. 100-0607 (HB2354) – Emergency Lethal Order of Protection, can take away firearms, FOID, and CCW license, for immediate and present danger by having in his/her custody, control, owning, purchasing, possessing, or receiving a firearm.
 - P.A. 100-0792 (SB2527) – Prohibits a school board from limited the number of dual credit courses a student may enroll in or the number of credits a student may receive from dual credit courses. Also may not limit access to, number of enrolled courses, or number of credits received for district online learning program.
 - SB3411 –Stalking Safeguard, now includes unwanted social media messages and authorized agent of a school may petition.
 - SB3466 – Adds as a valid cause to not attend school a circumstance when a person who has custody of a child withholds the child from school due to a bona fide dispute over special education services or placement.
 - SB3536 – EC programs must collect and review chronic absence data and recommend fixes
 - All K-12 staff must be trained to identify the warning signs of mental illness and suicidal behaviors in youth and shall be taught appropriate intervention and referral techniques (expanded from adolescents and tends) at least every 2 years.
 - Continued law development on human trafficking
 - ISBE is to provide clarification for 8th graders old enough to take the 2019 PSAT
